In the bustling streets of Bhutto Colony, Karachi, 17-year-old Ayaz and his father struggled to make ends meet by selling fruits on a humble wheelbarrow. With seven siblings to support, their meager earnings were their lifeline.

However, Ayaz's life took a tragic turn when he was arrested and charged in a gutka mawa act case, leading to his imprisonment at the Youthful Offenders Industrial School (YOIS) in Karachi. His hopes for a better future seemed shattered until a glimmer of hope emerged.

Despite the court granting Ayaz bail, securing his release required a sum of Rs. 10,000/= as surety, a staggering amount for his underprivileged family to gather.
