

JUSTICE SUCCESS STORY

From Darkness to Light: Sajjad's Path to Justice

This is the story of Sajjad Ali, a 15-year-old resident of Larkana. He worked as a motorbike mechanic, earning a daily wage of Rs. 400. One day, while working at a shop, the police arrived and arrested him based on the nomination of an already arrested accused, falsely accusing him of house trespass at night.

Sajjad belonged to a very poor and underprivileged background, and neither he nor his family could afford to hire an advocate.

During a visit to the Youthful Offender Industrial School (YOIS) in Larkana, Sajjad requested legal assistance. His vakalatnama was taken, and he was assigned Mohammad Yunus an advocate from the Committee for the Welfare of Prisoners. The vakalatnama was filed on 2nd January, 2024, and the case proceedings moved to the next stage.

After reviewing all case records, the court noted several contradictions in the prosecution's case and police story.

For instance, no recovery was made from Sajjad, and he was not nominated in the case by the complainant. These discrepancies led to his acquittal from the false and fabricated charges. Sajjad was released on 2nd February, 2024.

The entire legal process took just one month to conclude, and Sajjad was able to return to his life, grateful for the legal assistance that helped him prove his innocence.
